Important Safety Information

For use by the custodial parent or the guardian who has the child(ren)

Attached are optional forms. You only need to fill out a form if you have safety concerns.

"Safety concerns" means it may not be safe for the parent or other party to get documents that include your address or other personal information, or for the Division of Child Support (DCS) or the District Attorney (DA) to work your case.

When you have safety concerns

If you do have safety concerns, you can choose between Option 1 and Option 2:

1. You can ask to keep your personal information protected *(Claim of Risk)* while the Child Support Program helps you get child and medical support.

Your personal information is confidential when it's in child support records. However, documents sent to the parent, other party, or filed in court may include your address and other personal information and could help someone find you. If you think you or the child could be harmed, DCS and the DA may be able to protect your personal information and other information that may be used to locate you or the child. You can ask that this information not be given because of safety concerns. This is called "Claim of Risk." To make a Claim of Risk, complete the Claim of Risk form (DHS 8660B) in this packet and send it to your DCS or DA worker.

- OR -

2. You can ask DCS or the DA to not work your case (Good Cause) if it is not safe to pursue support or to establish a legal father for the child.

With one exception, DCS or the DA will not work your case. The exception is when a man applies for services to prove he is the legal father of the child. If this happens you will not be required to cooperate with DCS or the DA, although they may be required to give him services. You can ask for Good Cause in person, by phone, in writing or by using the Good Cause form (DHS 8660C) in this packet. If you get cash or medical help from the Department of Human Services (DHS), send the form to your DHS worker. Otherwise, send it to your DCS or DA worker.

Note: if there is an existing support order, the paying parent may not be able to buy, sell or refinance property until the support is current. This is called a "lien." Asking for Good Cause does not release the lien. To find out how to release a lien, call your DCS or DA worker.

You can ask for *Good Cause* at any time and you can have *Good Cause* removed at any time.

If you need an interpreter or information from a form or other notice translated into your language, you can get that service for free. You can also get information in an "alternate format" including Braille, large print and audio. To ask for these services, please contact a DCS or DA office.

These safety forms are a joint effort of the Department of Human Services and the Oregon Child Support Program.

Do not give this information to the other parent or person.

I know that information not listed above may be given to the other parent or person in a legal proceeding. This includes information I provide about my income or situation. I also know that I must give a contact address that will be given to the other parent or person.

I know that my contact address:

- Will be given to the other parent or person during the legal proceeding;
- **Must** be in the same state where I live and is a place I must check often for legal papers;
- Will be used for all legal papers unless I have a lawyer;
- Is good unless and until I tell DCS or the DA that it is no longer needed or mail is returned from it;
- Can be updated at any time. I can fill out this form again or call DCS or the DA; and
- Is used **only** for legal papers. If I get cash help or child support checks, they will still go to my home or mailing address.

Good Cause means DCS or the DA will not work your case.

I understand:

- If I get help from DHS, I may ask for "Good Cause." DHS will decide if good cause applies.
- If I do not get help from DHS, I may ask DCS or the DA for good cause. DCS or the DA will decide whether good cause applies. If it applies, they may close my case.

I understand that if good cause is found:

- The Child Support Program **may** not establish paternity or child support, will not enforce a child support order and will close my case.
- A man may apply for services from DCS or the DA to prove that they are the legal father. If this happens, I will not have to cooperate with DCS or the DA, but they may have to give him services.
- The other parent may still begin a legal action for paternity or child support on his or her own.
- I may ask to have a lien released on real property of the parent who is supposed to pay. To have a lien released, I must sign a lien release form and submit it to DCS or the DA. I may request this form from my local DCS or DA office. I understand that a lien that has been released may be put back at my request.
- I can ask for good cause at any time and I can have good cause removed at any time
