IMMIGRATION BASICS

- Watered down due process
- No independent judiciary
- Imm. Courts, ICE, CBP, USCIS, all part of Executive Branch



WHAT'S HAPPENING ON THE GROUND

- National Guard? As of today, TRO
- No Formal Enforcement Priorities
- Expanded Expedited Removal (enjoined)
- Enforcement at USCIS?
- SCOTUS and Racial Profiling
- Anticipate increased enforcement actions

SANCTUARY

OREGON SANCTUARY LAWS

- Not a legal term of art
- Oregon: First state to pass a sanctuary law (1987)
- Sanctuary Promise Act (2021)
- Applies to all "public bodies"

ICE CAN STILL OPERATE IN ANY PUBLIC SPACE

WHAT IF THERE'S A VIOLATION?

- ANYONE can report to state hotline I-844-924-STAY (I-844-924-7829)
 - -Victims connected to resources
 - -State may investigate
- ANYONE can file a civil lawsuit for injunctive or declaratory relief

KNOWYOUR RIGHTS

KENNETH'S 3 RULES

- I. Don't trust police/ICE*
- 2. Don't talk to police/ICE**
- 3. Don't consent to a search***

- * Not because they're bad people, but because they legally can and often do LIE
- ** Case-by-case exceptions in immigration context
- *** No exceptions!

IMMIGRATION BONUS:

Don't sign anything that you don't understand. Talk to a lawyer first.

JUDICIAL V. ADMINISTRATIVE WARRANT

JUDICIAL WARRANT

- Will have name of state or federal court at top, like "Oregon District Court"
- Be signed by state or federal judge or magistrate
- State the address of premises to be searched
- Be executed w/n time period specified on warrant

ADMINISTRATIVE WARRANT

- Will have "Dept. of Homeland Security" or "Immigration and Nationality Act" at top
- Be signed by an immigration officer or judge

ICE ARRESTS

- ICE typically dress in **plain clothes** or wear vests that say **police**.
- ICE can arrest someone without a warrant in public if
 - There is **reason to believe** the person is **removable** AND
 - The person is **likely to escape** before a warrant can be obtained. 8 C.F.R. § 287.8(c)(2)(i)-(ii).
- Different rules apply at the border.
- Firmly assert rights but don't be confrontational.

DON'T OBSTRUCT

- Do not physically obstruct an ICE officer, even if you believe they are acting unlawfully.
- Federal criminal harboring law prohibits concealing, harboring, or shielding an undocumented immigrant from authorities, when done with knowledge or reckless disregard of the immigrant's unlawful status. 8 U.S.C. §1324(a)(1)(A)(iii).

Ask yourself:

- I. Is it a legally available option?
- 2. Is there a **non-immigration** reason to do it?

REPORTING ICE ACTIVITY: S.A.L.U.T.E.

- Size: How many officers and vehicles did you see?
- Activity: What were the agents doing? Be specific.
- Location: Where was the activity happening?
- Uniform: What were the officers wearing? Look for logos, badges, etc.
- Time: What date and time did the event occur?
- Equipment: What equipment, weapons, tech, etc. did officers use?

PIRC Hotline to Report ICE Activity I-888-622-1510

FILMING ICE

- Only if safe. Assess your own risk.
- Film openly, not secretly or covertly
- If told to stop, state: "I have the right to film this."
- If told to step back: Film yourself moving back and then keep filming the scene
- Narrate facts only: time, location, number of agents
- **NEVER** reveal your immigration status unless you are a U.S. citizen
- Remember, anything said in the video can be used in court.

STEP 1: WHAT TO FILM

- √ Badges & uniforms (or lack of ID)
- √ Vehicle plates & equipment
- ✓ Street signs & landmarks
- √ Time, date, number of agents (state aloud)
- √ Clear audio of what ICE says or yells
- √ Film continuously, if you can, from the beginning to the end
- X DON'T focus on the person arrested

STEP 2: CALL PIRC RIGHT AWAY

When the incident is over (or if multiple people are available, one can call while another films), report the arrest to the PIRC Hotline immediately:

Call I-888-622-1510. The operator will explain where to send the video clip.

Please do not share videos on social media so lawyers, advocates, or family can decide when to release it.
