The second goal of the project is to improve access to confidential advocacy for students of Clackamas Community College (CCC) through co-located campus advocacy and outreach. The last goal of the project is to enhance and expand meaningful access to culturally proficient and population-specific services for underserved adult, youth, and child sexual assault victims, as well as their non-offending family and household members, ensuring they receive trauma-informed support that promotes healing, safety, and connection. There are several funded positions that will assist with accomplishing these goals: a) 0.50 FTE Latinx Services Advocate; b) 0.50 FTE Sexual Assault Advocate; c) 0.25 FTE CCC Sexual Assault Advocate; and d) 0.15 FTE Sexual Assault Program Manager.	\$163,062.07

The secondary goal is to increase the safety and well-being of survivors with developmental disabilities of Sexual Assault by increasing access to developmentally disabled population specific confidential advocacy services. There are several funded positions that will assist with accomplishing these goals: a) 0.10 FTE Deputy Director; b) 0.60 FTE Youth Advocate; c) 0.60 FTE Youth Advocate; d) 0.15 FTE Director of Sexual Assault Services; and e) 0.05 FTE HR Coordinator.	\$133,606.84

Sexual Assault Support Services	Lane	The main goal of the project is to expand access to culturally and linguistically relevant services to survivors of sexual violence in Lane County who are Latine, Limited English Proficient, and Rural. The second goal is to provide and strengthen culturally and linguistically relevant services to Latine survivors of sexual violence in Lane County so that they can stay safe and heal from the violence and trauma they have experienced. There are several funded positions that will assist with accomplishing these goals: a) 0.10 FTE Community Programs Manager; b) 1.0 FTE Latine Community Coordinator; and c) 1.0 FTE Survivor Access Coordinator.	\$210,968.26
