Robin opened the meeting with an introduction of April Aamodt who is the newest member of the group, and introductions were made.



OCAS and RCAC Updates

Amelia Siders, contractor with OCAS, described the collaborative efforts to draft the Drug Endangered Children (DEC) revised protocol which is a component of the Oregon Model Protocol Template. The process added refined terminology and outlined roles for MDT participants particularly law enforcement and Oregon Department of Human Services (ODHS). The document details best practice but allows for adaptations for county multidisciplinary teams (MDTs). In addition to the protocol, complementary resources and tools will be developed for varieties of counties, partnerships, and constituents.

Regarding the Child Fatality Review Protocol, Sarah Stewart, contractor with OCAS, reviewed the new content in the protocol which provides recommendations to support prevention and death review best practices within county teams.

Additionally, Sarah is working with the State Child Death Review and Prevention Team to produce resources to assist county fatality review teams to conduct efficient, trauma informed meetings and support participants.

Tina Morgan, CJA Chair and OCAS contractor, reviewed updates to the Oregon Model Protocol Template language about meaningful access to services, which mirrors the related language in the ODOJ CAMI Handbook. The changes are to the language used, not services provided. The Model Protocol Template assists child abuse MDTs with National Children's Alliance (NCA) accreditations and is consistent with CAMI and Federal funding requirements.

Approval of the October and November meeting minutes

The meeting minutes for the October CAMI AC meeting were approved without edits.

The meeting minutes for the November CJA TF meeting were approved without edits.

CVSSD, CAMI and CJA Updates

Kevin shared that Helping Hearts has received NCA accreditation due in part to the strength of their relationship with their county MDT, partnership with OCAS, and Tina Morgan's help. Currently 14 of 24 children's advocacy centers (CACs) are accredited and several others are working toward the national standard.

Other CACs in Oregon are struggling which is causing ripples of concern throughout the counties in which they are based and adjacent counties and challenges for partners and constituents. OCAS is working with Oregon District Attorney Association (ODAA) to strengthen collaboration among CACs, MDTs, and DAs.

CAMI And CJA Membership

A new CAC representative, pending approval, will join the groups in April. Robin requested that members of the group review the existing vacancies and forward recommendations to her. Recruitment efforts are ongoing.

CAMI MDT Progress Report Changes

Robin provided background on the current CAMI MDT Progress Report components. The report is now required quarterly and includes extensive demographic data and several narratives. Robin and Kevin are streamlining the report to provide meaningful, statutorily compliant data and will provide drafts to state stakeholders for review. Defining terminology will provide consistency in reporting. The group discussed



possible causes for discrepancies highlighted in current data and the benefit that current questions help guide MDT work. CVSSD anticipates the updated reports will be implemented starting July 1, 2026 following stakeholder input.
